

Innovation has impacts on Business


ESRI/EI Study: Product Lifetimes in export markets are only 1-3 years on average: constant innovation is required to maintain/grow exports

The company has identified a commercial opportunity for an innovative product, process or service that it needs to develop and an Irish academic research group has the Research capability to help the company.






Main Reasons for companies to do Collaborative R&D





Funding Rates – Enterprise Ireland Contribution




Every company partner will be expected to pay 20% of the project costs in cash
